

BERLIN AGAIN ASKS FOR ALIEN REGISTRATION

COUNCIL REPEATS ONCE MORE
ITS REQUEST TO DEPART-
MENT OF JUSTICE.

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Berlin, Ont., Feb. 7.—The City Council this evening decided to make another request to the Department of Justice in Ottawa to establish an office in this city for registration of enemies of alien birth. The Council made two similar requests during the early stages of the war, but the request was not granted. The Police Magistrate and the Chief of Police were instructed to register aliens reported to them, but this has not proved as satisfactory as was desired.

KING CONSTANTINE INCREASES ARMY

Athens, Feb. 7.—King Constantine to-day signed a decree calling to the colors the members of all classes from 1892 to 1914, inclusive, who are living abroad, with the exception of those who are now living in Russia, Turkey, Bulgaria and Roumania.

This decree will add to the Greek army about 90,000 men, many of them veterans of the Balkan wars.

QUIET, SAYS LONDON.

Only German Artillery Activity in
Loos Region.

London, Feb. 7.—The British official statement on the progress of the campaign in the west, issued to-night, reads:

"Except for some hostile artillery activity about Loos and the bombardment of hostile trenches near the Ypres-Roulers railway, the day has been quiet."
