When in June they saw that the Germans had failed to come, they knew that they

had been fooled, and came to Fort Resolution as in previous years. We explained to them in the best way possible that they had no cause for fear of any enemies ever coming to the northern country; that the Allies had already beaten the Germans; and that it was only a matter of time

before there will be peace again." Not a few of our Indians are with the Canadian troops in Europe helping to settle terrorism of that

sort forever.
