

## OVER 4,000 CANADIANS HAVE REACHED ENGLAND

**METAGAMA AND LAPLAND ARE  
REPORTED—CARRIED LARGE  
CONTINGENTS.**

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Ottawa, March 28.—It is officially announced through the Chief Press Censor's Office that the troopship Metagama, which sailed from Canada on March 11, and the troopship Lapland, which sailed on March 13, have arrived safely in England.

The Metagama had on board the following troops: Three Engineer Field Companies, 18 officers, 670 men. Three Divisional Signalling Companies, five officers, 198 men. Third Divisional Ammunition Column, 14 officers, 544 men. Reinforcements Engineers, 43 officers, 103 men. Signallers, 10 officers. Medical, three officers, 99 men. Civilian Medical Practitioners for Army, 9. Details, three officers, five men. Total, 105 officers and 1,625 men.

The Lapland had on board the following troops: 33rd Battalion, 40 officers, 946 men. 45th Battalion, 38 officers, 1,119 men. Draft Royal Canadian Dragoons, three officers, 75 men. Draft, 1st Canadian Pioneer Battalion, three officers, 100 men. Officer for R. A. M. C., 1. Total, 85 officers and 2,240 men. Total troops aboard both vessels, 4,055.

## Guilty of Wounding; May be Interned

Although found guilty of wounding, Mike Dolinsky, Pete Zatacona and John Patranco may yet be dealt with by internment officials. Judge Coatsworth in the Criminal Sessions yesterday found they were guilty of wounding Mike Walko and Mike Baransky on March 4 during an altercation. They were remanded until this afternoon in order that the registration officials may see them. The prisoners claim they are Russians, but Crown Prosecutor Thurston thinks they are Gallicians.
