CHARGE AGAINST PRIEST WITHDRAWN

A charge of sedition against the

Rev. Father Anastaslus Fillipow, a priest of the Basilian order of the Ruthenian Catholic church, was withdrawn by the military authorities in the provincial police court Tuesday afternoon. R. D. Guy, who appeared for the military authorities, said they were satisfied that if there had been any gullt on the part of the accused, it had been sufficiently expiated by the worry and inconvenience of being haled into court. As a mutter of fact a number of influential citizens had vouched for the conduct of Father Fillipow. T. J. Murray, representing Father

Fillipow, said that investigation had satisfied him there was no gulit on the part of the accused. He had not, in fact, been a party to the conversations that were the bass of the information. Mr. Marray said he had communicated this data to the in-

telligence department of the military

district and he believed it had in-

fluenced the department to withdraw the charge.

It was alleged that Father Fillipow had advised Austrians to leave Canada, and join the Teutonic forces.

Mr. Murray sald to a Free Press man that there was no truth in this allegation. What Father Fillipow had said was that there was no liberty in Russia, and that there was some liberty in Germany and Austria. He had not said anything about the Brit-

ish empire, to which he was thoroughly loyal.
