

## INTERNMENT CAMP AT KAPUSKASING

This camp is located at McPherson station 70 miles west of Cochrane. There are 1700 prisoners, mostly Austrians and Turks. There is a guard of 250. They have a prison-camp with 25 to 30 houses, hospitals, etc. Then there are the dwellings of the officers and the non-com. officers and their families, about 35 houses. They have a public school and a preacher who uses the school. The prisoners are used to clear the land which is very good. They have now cleared about two or three (2 or 3) townships and constructed fifty miles of roads and are working all the time. They get their board, lodging and clothes per day for their work. This is charged to their credit and Germany will have to pay it. They have a saw-mill and cut all their own lumber. Erect their own houses, barns, bridges, etc.

The camp is on the river of the same name as the camp Kapuskasing, which is wide and deep, flowing north to Hudson Bay.
