

Who Von Der Goltz Is—Some of His
Late Confessions.

Heret Von de Goltz, a confessed German spy and conspirator, who saved himself from being shot as a spy in the Tower of London, by confessing that he was concerned in plots to invade Canada and agreeing to come over to the United States to "squeal" on his pals, has told a story that shows how near this country came to get into trouble and the Welland Canal blown up. Von Goltz's confession shows Von Papen and Hoy, Ed to be among the conspirators and that Count Bernstorff, the German Ambassador at Washington, was cognizant of what was going on, if not a participator in the scheme.

Von Goltz declares that Von Papen first planned to raid the Canadian towns on the Great Lakes with motor boats armed with machine guns. This did not come to anything. Then it was proposed to dynamite railway junctions, grain elevators and the locks of canals. Before these could be put into execution the troops at Valcartier sailed for France. As the object of these ventures was to scare Canada into keeping these troops from going abroad the mission of the dynamiters was a failure and came to naught.

The unearthing of the recent conspiracy at New York, in which many wealthy Germans are concerned and a friend of Von ~~Repp~~ involved, it can be seen that Canada should be ever on the alert for any machinations of the enemy. Watchfulness and preparedness should be our mot-
