

Busy Scenes at Petawawa Camp

Lieut. Col. R. W. Gregory to be Commandant—Preparing for 10,000 Troops—3,000 Men at Niagara—Pool and Grey County Battalions Reached the Camp Yesterday

Orders for the mobilization of artillery units at Petawawa Camp have been issued and the 12th Brigade from Exhibition Camp, Toronto, will move to the Petawawa camping area about the end of May, with their advance party going into camp on May 26th.

Lieut.-Col. R. W. Gregory, O.C., the 1st Mounted Brigade, the Toronto military district, and recently commandant of the detention camp at Petawa, has been appointed commandant at Petawawa training camp. It is intended to use the Petawawa area primarily for an artillery camp, and from 4000 to 5000 artillerymen will be concentrated there, and possibly the same number of infantry soldiers will also train there, preparations for the reception of approximately 10,000 troops being now under way at the camp. The artillery units from Exhibition Camp, which form the 12th Brigade, will be supplemented by artillery units from other Eastern military districts. Lt.-Col. Gregory, who will have command of the camp, was with Brig.-Gen. Elliot at Sewell Camp last year, when he was in command of mounted troops in the area.
