

13 MORE PRISONERS REACH FORT HENRY.

Seven of These From Boats That Supplied German Cruisers.

Thirteen more German prisoners were brought to Fort Henry Wednesday. Seven of these were brought from the West Indies, the other six being picked up in Eastern Canada. It was reported that two of the seven that came from the West Indies had been officers off the Emden, a German cruiser, which was sunk some months ago by an Australian warship, the Sydney, but this report could not be verified in official circles. The probable explanation is that the report owed its origin to the fact that the men were all taken off boats which had been supplying the Emden and other German raiders.

The prisoners were in charge of Capt J. B. Lambkin and nine N.C.O.'s from the 57th Regiment, Quebec, who all registered at Hotel Frontenac.

There are now about 375 war prisoners in Fort Henry.
