

ALIENS RELEASED TO WORK IN MILLS.

Labor Question Causes Action of Government—Nearly Half Are Free.

Ottawa, July 17.—The demand for labor throughout the country is causing many of the interned aliens to be released from the camps. At Spirit Lake there are only seventy-five now, while at Kapuskasing the number is less than half what it was. The men released are mostly Austrians and Galicians, who were interned not because of any hostile acts, but rather on account of being public charges. The dangerous elements are at Fort Henry, Kingston; Amherst, N.S., and a few at Vernon. The men released have gone to work mainly in pulp or paper mills or on railway construction.
