

CALLS CANADIANS HOGS AND THIEVES; SEDITION CHARGED

Alberta Farmer Alleged to Have Let His Language Run Riot

Because Henry Heinle, a farmer living near Romania P. O., Alberta, is alleged to have started a miniature war all his own and during the manoeuvres gave utterance to certain statements that are not altogether appropriate during hostilities in Europe, he will come before Inspector Jennings of the Mounted police on two charges, sedition and intimidation.

According to witnesses for the crown, Heinle made the following statement, which got him into trouble:

"If you want a road through here and this is King George's ——— rules, I don't want his land. I am under no king; I am not under your British laws, or your British flag. I am an American citizen, where they have got good men, not ——— hogs and thieves. George can have his ——— land and as they have it here in Canada, King be ———."

If found guilty, Heinle will probably have his wish to return to the United States granted. If found guilty of intimidation which was it is alleged, a threat against a neighbour with a gun, he may get several other things before he returns to the U. S. A.
