KITCHENER CELEBRATED

Parade and Joy-Making Marked Passing of Berlin's Name. Kitchener. Ont., Aug. 24,—The

citizens of old Berlin, Ont., celebrated the change of name yesterday by an enthusiastic automobile parade

through the main streets of the city last night. The notification of the Cabinet's action was received about two o'clock in the afternoon, and the news was spread through the town by the ringing of the fire and church bells, and the blasting of many whistles. The chimes of St. Peter's Lutheran Church pealed forth patriotic airs, including Rule Britannia and

the National Anthem, while pennants with the new name of Kitchener inscribed on them were being sold in the streets within a few minutes of the announcement.

An informal meeting of the business men of Waterloo and Gerlin was held, at which the question of joint management of the various municipal utilities was discussed, with a view to reducing expenditures, and at the same time permitting the two towns to use the historical names of Kitchener and Waterloo.
