

WAR PRISONER BURIED.

Two Fellow-Germans Were Allowed to Attend Funeral.

The funeral of Emil Heyse, a German prisoner of war in Fort Henry, took place Monday morning from R. J. Reid's undertaking parlors to Cataract Cemetery, the service being conducted by Canon Fitzgerald. Two fellow-Germans were allowed to attend the funeral as representatives of the prisoners' club, which was formed some months ago at the fort, and which looks after the social and athletic diversions of the prisoners.

Permission was received from Ottawa to allow the two prisoners to attend the funeral, and they were in charge of an escort. They brought a number of handsome floral tributes from the inmates of the fort, some of which were artificial, having been made by the prisoners.
