

TORONTO'S HONOR ROLL

Lieut. John Gilmour Hay, at one time a Toronto lawyer and latterly City Solicitor in Vancouver, is reported to have died of wounds. About twelve years ago he was a partner in the firm of Clute, MacDonald, MacIntosh & Hay, but he moved west when the boom of the Klondyke came, and for a short time he practised in Dawson City itself. He, however, was not in Dawson City long, but removed to Vancouver, where he was in partnership with the Hon. Joseph Martin before getting the post of corporation lawyer, when the partnership was dissolved. Lieut. Hay was in private practice for a couple of years before enlisting in the 74th Battalion, with which he went overseas. He was wounded in the Somme offensive. A brother, Mr. M. G. Hay, is with the Copp, Clark Co., Toronto.

Lieut.-Col. F. F. Clarke, who is in command of the 127th York Rangers is reported in a letter to his wife to be ill with a severe cold, though when the letter was written he was improving. Lieut.-Col. Clarke had been an officer in the militia for twelve years before enrolling for overseas work, when he was a Major in the York Rangers. For a year he was Commandant of the **Internment** camp at Kapuskasing. He is a South African veteran.

Lieut. Richard Treacy a brother of Rev. Dr. Treacy, St. Cecilia's Church, Toronto, has been wounded. He was in the Royal Dublin Fusiliers and was in the Balkans when wounded on Sept. 22. He has now been removed to a hospital in Egypt, but the cabled information does not state the nature of the wounds.

Lieut. J. F. W. Anderson, 206 Grenadier road, is reported wounded, but the information does not say what the nature of the wound or its seriousness is.

Lieut. J. R. Tarras, a brother of Mr. H. M. Tarras, Toronto, has been wounded. He has two brothers fighting and a sister nursing.

Pte. Norman Bell, whose mother lives at 47 Elm grove, is reported killed in action on October 30. He enlisted in a Winnipeg battalion.

Gunner Oliver Dalrymple, a brother of Dr. J. M. Dalrymple, Toronto, is reported killed in action after having been fourteen days in the trenches. He was in the University Battery which went overseas in June last. His father lives near Niagara Falls.
