

ICE PALACE UNDER WAY COMMITTEES WORKING HARD

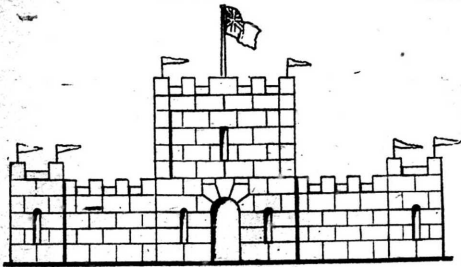
Work started on the construction of the ice palace and maze Tuesday morning and good progress is being made. The huge structure, 90 ft. long by 60 ft. wide, will ornament the corner of Banff avenue and Cariboo street. The front elevation will be 30 feet, with towers, battlements and bastions. Inside the palace will be the maze, composed of intricate passages calculated to puzzle those who attempt to thread its windings.
