HELD AS ALIEN

Former Interpreter Is Arrested On Charge of Concealing Weapon

Constantine Haluczuk, formerly interpreter at the Transcona police court, is under arrest at the railroad town on a charge of "being an alien and concealing weapons." The weapon in question, it transpired, today is a 22 calibre rifle which the accused bought in 1912, and for which he has never been able to obtain ammunition, according to his own statement.

Haluczuk is also held on a charge of non-support. In February Haluczuk was prosecuted by his wife on a similar charge in Magistrate Macdonald's court in Winnipeg. He stated he was willing to support his wife and the charge was dismissed. Mrs. Haluczuk has now laid a charge against her husband in the Transcona court.

Today J. D. Suffield, counsel for the accused, was granted a change of venue for the trial. The matter will come up for hearing in the County Court of Winnipeg in a few days.

What action is to be taken with reference to the concealed "weapon" does not yet transpire.
