BANFF INTERNMENT

Calgary, July 23.—The remainder of the German and Austrian interns at the Banff camp are shortly to be moved to Cochrane, Ont., where it is

stated they will be put on government work. For some considerable time past now those who have been of general good conduct have been allowed

to take up work on the land, and in connection with railway construction. The others, numbering from fifty to seventy-five, with whom there has

been more or less trouble since their confinement, will be sent to the East under an escort of a large party of the 103rd Calgary Rifles. When these interns depart it is the intention of the government to close the intern-

ment camp at Banff.
