

City Council Asks Militia To Support Aliens' Families

At Tuesday night's meeting of the city council the city solicitor, Theo. A. Hunt, was instructed, on motion of Alderman W. B. Simpson, seconded by Controller A. W. Puttee, to take up immediately with the department of alien enemies the question of reimbursement to the city for relief being administered by the social welfare commission to the destitute families of aliens sentenced on July 21 by Major Jackson, under the war measure act, relating to enemy aliens.

Alderman Simpson stated that 11 families, with an aggregate of 23 persons, have been looked after by the commission, and this would probably cost \$750 for the three months during which they would be without their bread-winners. The men were sentenced as the result of labor troubles, he said.
