PEACE DISTURBERS BARRED FROM CANADA

Dominion Immigration Authorities Will Keep Disturbers From Border.

Special to The Star. Winnipeg, Man., Sept. 6 .- The Do-

minion's immigration officials have succeeded in their fight to keep I. W. W. agitators south of the inter-

national border. J. Bruce Walker, Commissioner of Immigration, stated to-day that since

the arrest and conviction of the first six men who made their way into Western harvest fields there has been no trouble. Constant vigilance on the part of the border officials has made it impossible for others to get into the country, although many

have tried. Govt. Commences Investigation.

Special to The Star. Washington, Sept. 6 .- The Govern-

ment proposes to eliminate I.W.W. and other anti-American activity from the nation's political and commercial structure. To this end Government investiga-

tors throughout the country to-day examined the I.W.W. and Socialist documents gleaned in yesterday's sweep on many headquarters. Evidence already in the Depart-

ment of Justice shows that the I. W. W. activities have embarrassed industries, particularly the Western mines, producing war material. This evidence shows, too, that the I. W. W. proposed to spread its doctrines of violence all over the land.

The patriotic education society today charged directly that Austrians and Bulgars are responsible for these disorders, acting for the German secet service. The extent of J. W. W. ans is indicated by the openly exressed fear that they might try to capture the Minneapolis session of the American Alliance for Labor and

Democracy and distort its delibera-tions into I. W. W. propaganda.
