

SAYS HE IS SPY IN GERMANY'S PAY

Dominion Police Hold Man Arrested in Ottawa—Tracing His Record

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Ottawa, Sept. 21.—An alleged self-confessed spy, who is said to have admitted to the authorities that he is in the employ of the German Government, has been arrested by the Dominion Police and is now held in custody.

The man, whose name is given as F. Archer, was arrested a week ago by Dominion Police Officer Knox at the Russell Hotel, where he was staying. He came up in Police Court this morning before Magistrate Askwith and was again remanded for a week, at the request of the Dominion Police authorities, who are tracing up his antecedents. Just what the scope of the spy's activities have been, or where they have been confined to, cannot be ascertained, as both the Dominion Police and the local authorities are observing the strictest secrecy regarding the man.

WOULD FIX PRICES OF ESSENTIAL PRODUCTS

AMERICAN BUSINESS MEN IN WAR CONVENTION MAKE RECOMMENDATION.

Atlantic City, N.J., Sept. 21.—Government price-fixing of all essential products, not only in sales to the Government but to the public as well, was recommended in resolutions adopted to-day at the closing session of the War Convention of American Business Men. The convention advocated legislative creation of a general Government Purchasing Department which, in addition to fixing prices, would have power to distribute the output of industries in a manner most necessary to the conduct of the war.

The attitude of Business toward Labor was defined in resolutions recommending that the Labor standard is much changed, and that a Labor Adjustment Board be named to handle all major disputes. The declaration was made for industry that it endorse a policy of no lockouts or strikes while differences were before the board, and Labor was urged to take a similar stand.
