

# AUSTRO-HUNGARIANS BEING ROUNDED UP

**MANY UNDER SUSPICION IN U.S.  
FOR SOME TIME AR-  
RESTED.**

Washington, Dec. 9 —The round-up of Austro-Hungarian enemies began yesterday throughout the United States with agents of the Department of Justice being assisted by local authorities. With the declaration of war more than a million subjects of Austria-Hungary living in this country were added to the lists of alien enemies.

Government agents yesterday rounded up many Austrians who long have been suspected of conspiring to hamper the Government's war plans, but against whom definite evidence has been lacking. They will be interned if they fail to convince officials of their peaceful intentions.

All Austro-Hungarians were barred from the 100-yard zones established about piers, docks, warehouses and terminals, and will be required to register with the police as soon as regulations are promulgated. In cities where the foreign population is large, particularly in steel manufacturing centres and mining districts, the task will be enormous.

J. Ernest Kunwald, an Austrian subject and director of the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra, was arrested in Cincinnati by United States Marshal Devanney on an order received from Attorney-General Gregory at Washington. Marshal Devanney announced that Prof. Kunwald was arrested in accordance with article 12 of the President's proclamation relative to alien enemies.
