

## GERMAN IS REMANDED.

Pleads in Vain to Fight His Countrymen  
—Convicted of Perjury.

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Windsor, Jan. 3.—Pleading that he had no love for his Fatherland and Prussian methods, but was anxious and willing to shoulder a rifle and fight against his own countrymen, Bernhard Lifkin, a German, tried to induce Police Magistrate Leggatt in the Police Court to-day to give him his freedom. The court, however, turned a deaf ear to Lifkin's story, and remanded him until next week for sentence on a perjury charge. Lifkin was released from jail at Sandwich last night after he had served a short term for failing to register as an alien enemy.

Later it was found he had sworn falsely as to his nationality in order to secure a passport to cross the river to Detroit. Lifkin had openly boasted he could come and go as he pleased, and this was the direct cause of his arrest.
