

COMMAND OF BRIGADE FOR COUNT CZERNIN

LATE FOREIGN SECRETARY OF
AUSTRIA GIVES UP POLITICS
FOR BATTLEFIELD.

Copenhagen, April 16. — Count Czernin, who resigned as Austrian Foreign Minister, has received command of an Austrian brigade on the Italian front, it was learned here to-day.

There was a sharp conflict of opinions when Czernin conferred with Emperor Karl on Sunday morning, it is said. Later, the Emperor received Count Tisza and Dr. Wekerle, the Hungarian Premier.

Fifty Delegates Only at Women's Conference

Berne, Switzerland, April 16.—Only about fifty delegates, instead of several hundred as expected, attended the opening session of the International Women's Conference for the Reconciliation of Peoples which began here to-day. Most of the women delegates from belligerent countries were refused passports, but some sent telegrams to the meeting. The conference will last for five days.

50 RECRUITS FOR R. A. F.

Kingston, April 16.—(Special.)—Fifty recruits were obtained here to-day from the Depot Battalion and Batteries by Lt. Arbor, Toronto, recruiting officer for the Royal Air Force.

ALIEN ENEMY LOSES CONTRACT.

Kingston, April 16.—(Special.)—An alien enemy baker doing business in Portsmouth has had his contract for supplying bread to Mowat Memorial Hospital taken away. Vigorous protest was made by the Great War and the Army and Navy Veterans' Associations here, and also the Trades and Labor Council, who are taking steps to see that alien enemies are given less privileges than they have been enjoying.
