

Inland Revenue Officers Barred Town Office

Windsor, May 1.—Collector of Inland Revenue Brain has been notified by the Department that no Inland Revenue official in future will be permitted to run for municipal office. Alderman P. M. Keoghy, the dean of the Windsor City Council, and School Trustee Thomas of Walkerville are affected by the new order.

FIGHT TO A FINISH.

Vancouver Council and Civic Employees Both Determined.

Vancouver, May 1.—The City Council has notified the striking Civic Service employees that unless they report for duty by Friday morning their places will be filled. G. W. MacFarlane, Business Agent of the City Employees' Union, stated that the City Council evidently intended to make it a "fight to a finish," and declared that there will not be a single man, outside of a couple of foremen, in the outside service of the city to-day.

CHARGED WITH SEDITION.

Chatham, May 1.—(Special.)—When Henry Jutinne came before Magistrate Arnold to-day evidence was given that he had boasted of being a German, that he had declared he was formerly an officer in the Flying Corps in the German army, and that he wished he was back in Germany so he could fight against the allies. He is being held for making seditious utterances. He will have a further hearing later in the week. His parents, who live near Merim, speak only German, and a brother of the prisoner is in an **internment** camp.
