

# National Registration

Every person in Canada, male and female, of sixteen years and over, must sign between June 17th and June 22nd a registration card. Those not sixteen years of age by June 22nd must register within thirty days of attaining that age. Only cloistered nuns, persons upon active service, either naval or military, persons confined to asylums, penitentiaries or prisons are exempt from registration. As long as a person delays to register he shall forfeit his right to vote, to continue in any employment or receive salary of any kind, to purchase or receive rail or steamboat ticket, or to get board or lodging at any hotel, club, restaurant or boarding house. In addition he shall be guilty of an offence and be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars and to imprisonment not exceeding one month, and to a further penalty of ten dollars for each day after Registration Day during which he shall continue to be unregistered.

The following questions have to be answered as appearing on the Registration Cards:

## Card for Males

1. Name.
2. Address in full.
3. Age.
4. Date of birth.
5. Country of birth.
6. British subject (by birth or by naturalization).
7. If naturalized (when and where.)
8. Single, married, widower or divorced.
9. Physical disability, if any.
10. Present occupation, regular occupation. What other work can you do?
11. If an employee, state employer's name, address and nature of business.
12. Do your circumstances permit you to serve in the present national crisis by changing your present occupation to some other, for which you are qualified, if the conditions offered are satisfactory?
13. Were you brought up on a farm? Are you a retired farmer? Are you willing to do farm work? Can you handle horses? Drive tractors? Use farm machinery?
14. If not a British subject, to what country do you owe allegiance?
15. How many children under 16 years?
16. If registered under the Military Service Act, what is your serial number?

## Card for Females

1. Name.
  2. Address in full.
  3. Age.
  4. Nationality? Can you speak English? French?
  5. British subject? By birth? Naturalization? Marriage?
  6. Are you single? Married? Widowed? Divorced?
  7. How many children or wards under 16? Will these children be recorded by another registrant?
  8. Do your health and home ties permit you, if required to give full-time paid work?
- (Registrants answering "NO" here need not answer any of the following questions; if answering "YES" or, if in doubt, should fill up rest of card. All must sign affirmation.)
9. Do your circumstances permit you to live away from home?
  10. What is your present main occupation? If in business as employer state number of employees. If an employee state name, business and address of employer. If full-time voluntary worker, state name of Society served.
  11. State particulars of each, if you have Trade or Profession? Degree, diploma or certificate? Special training?
  12. State length of experience, if any in General farming; Truck farming; Fruit farming; Poultry farming; Dairy farming.
  13. Indicate here any qualification or practical experience which you possess, not already recorded.

15. Considering your health, training and experience, and the national needs, in what capacity do you think you could serve best?

16. Do your circumstances permit you to give regular full-time service without remuneration?
