

JOHN PEREHUDA TO STAND TRIAL

Alleged German Agent and I. W. W. Organizer Had Let- ters From Chicago

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Windsor, July 3.—Arraigned on charges of sedition and conspiracy against the Government of Canada, John Perekuda, twenty-six years old, alleged German agent and I. W. W. organizer, was committed for trial this afternoon by Magistrate Miers in Police Court.

Acting as interpreter for the Crown, Rev. Arcary Plotrowsky, who is in the employ of the Dominion Government as a secret service agent, testified that the pamphlets and letters found by the Dominion Police at Perekuda's home in Ford showed that the accused had been actively conspiring with officials of the I. W. W. to "overthrow all Kings, including Britain's Monarch."

That Perekuda had been an active member of the I. W. W. was disclosed by Rev. Mr. Plotrowsky's interpretation of letters which was alleged the Teuton agent received from Chicago. One letter found among Perekuda's effects congratulated him for the work he was doing to "exterminate all Kings, Kaisers and Presidents, who should be burned together in a pit."

It was also alleged that he incited European aliens resident in Essex county to ignore registration. The charges of conspiracy and sedition were made after investigation by Dominion Secret Service agents. That the I.W.W. has active branches in London, Montreal, Lachine, Hamilton, Toronto, Galt, St. Catharines and other points is also believed.
