HEAVILY FINED

Brantford, Ont., July 20.—Felix Cosanevitch, a Russian, was fined \$500 and cost, with the option of a year in jail, in Police Court here, for distributing literature tending to injure the prosecution of the war. The pamphlets sent around local factories by Cosanevitch, working through small boys, called for all workingmen to refuse to work more than four hours a

day, as this was enough for them to live on, and all work done over that time went into the pockets of the employer. The pamphlets urged that the workers refuse any longer to make profits for others, and that if they could not get their demands otherwise, they should lay down their tools.
