WOULD INTERN ALIEN FOE Strong Resolution Will be Submitted for Approval at G.W.V.A. Convention. The following resolution regarding

the alien labor question was unanimously adopted at a mass meeting held in Argyle Hall, Halifax, last week. It will be put before the Dominion convention and supported by the representatives from the Maritime associations. The resolu-

tion reads:
"Whereas, it is expressed to be the consensus of opinion of the citizens of Nova Scotia and it is the opinion of this branch of the Great War Veterans' Association that there are enemy allens and suspects in the city of Halifax and elsewhere in the Pro-

of Halifax and elsewhere in the Province of Nova Scotia whose presence and unrestricted freedom create a grave menace to the city of Halifax and other manufacturing ports and greatly prejudice the allied cause in this war.
"It is therefore resolved that the Department of Justice of the Government of Canada, as well as the Department of Militia and Defence, be

Department of Justice of the Government of Canada, as well as the Department of Militia and Defence, be respectfully urged to take some immediate steps whereby all enemy aliens and all persons suspected by competent authority of being such within the Province of Nova Scotia be interned in suitable internment camps to be provided for the purpose and be placed at work fitting

camps to be provided for the purpose and be placed at work fitting to their respective habitual occupations, to be consistent in so far as possible with the national requirements for labor and service, or in the event of the foregoing remedy for any good reason not being deemed by the Government to be in the interests of Canada or the allied cause, that some more effective measure be immediately taken to check the activities and avoid the possibility of the
