

TORONTO THE GOOD FAIRLY QUIET NOW

Toronto, Aug. 5.—This is Toronto's Civic Holiday and the city is comparatively quiet after the riotous demonstrations of the week end. Returned soldiers to the number of several hundred gathered at the city hall at the invitation of Mayor Church, to appoint their committee, to formulate and present to the police commissioners tomorrow their grievances against the police and the administration of the alien enemy regulations. They will demand more strict enforcement of the latter and the dismissal of several policemen whom they allege to have been too violent and abusive on Saturday night.

There were prospects of a further demonstration today when one of the audience in the soldiers' meeting declined to remove his hat when the National Anthem was being sung. The police arrested the man and avoided further scenes.
