Pte. J. M. Anderson Wounded.

Pte. J. Murray Anderson, who has had his right leg amputated, tried to enlist with the 15th Bn., in 1915, but he was rejected. So he spent a year at Camp **Kapuskasing**, and qualified for his commission. He then reverted to a private to join the 198th Bn. in 1916.



Soon he got his Pte. J. M. Anderson's sergeant's stripes, which he held until the battalion was broken up in England. He was recommended by Col. Rogers for a lieutenancy, but he preferred to go to France with his men as a private in the 2nd C.M.R., in April, 1918. He was wounded October 3, and moved to England October 9. Pte. Anderson was a St. Andrew's boy, and when he enlisted he was with the Home Bank. He is an only child. His parents live at 82 Howard street.
