

IS WAR MEASURES ACT ENDED WITH THE WAR?

Ottawa Disturbed Over Orders- in-Council, Especially That on Prohibition.

Ottawa, Nov. 2.—The question as to whether various orders-in-Council and regulations made under the War Measures Act lapse with the coming of peace is engaging consideration of the Government's legal advisers. It is held by some that while there is no question as to their constitutionality during the war, further Parliamentary legislation will be necessary to keep at least some of them in effect, especially that forbidding the manufacture, importation and transportation of intoxicating liquors during the war and twelve months afterwards.

The claim is made that the enabling act, the War Measures Act, will cease with the end of the war.
