

# LOAN TOTAL FOR THE DOMINION IS NOW \$367,864,150

**Toronto Took Spurt Yesterday, Turning in Over Nine Millions**

## ENEMY ALIEN A BUYER

**Austrian Recently Released From Internment Camp Puts Money Earned There Into Bonds**

Toronto, November 12.—Within four days of the end of the campaign Canada, as far as officially reported to Dominion Headquarters, has subscribed \$367,864,150 to the Victory Loan. Last year's figures for the same period were \$239,216,300.

The Province of Ontario (including Toronto) had by tonight reached \$185,214,850, or 84 per cent. of its objective. This is as against \$120,375,900 in 1917. Today's subscriptions were \$19,479,250.

Toronto got busy today and turned in \$9,602,600, bringing its total to \$73,805,550, as against \$51,352,000 last year, but Montreal went it better by reporting over twenty millions, making a total for that city of \$80,655,850.

The number of Ontario honor flags awarded to cities, counties and districts was doubled today, the following being added to the list: City of Welland, town of Orillia, Essex and Welland counties, Parry Sound district, and Tyendinaga township (Hastings County). In addition to these Hanover, in Grey County, reached 125 per cent. of its objective, adding a crown to its flag.

Divisional Organizer MacRae writes from Cochrane that Peter Hellevichk, an Austrian recently released from an internment camp, is one of the new purchasers of \$300 of Victory Bonds. It is interesting to note that these were paid for mostly from wages received during his internment by a cheque from that camp.

G. H. Wood, Ontario chairman, made the following comment on yesterday's returns:

"The total from the province tonight of \$19,479,250 looks good after an average of only \$6,800,000 for Friday, Saturday and Monday last. While this return is encouraging under the changed war conditions, it still leaves much to be desired. Of the day's total over \$13,000,000 came from the large cities of Toronto, Hamilton, Ottawa and London."

The report of Aemilius Jarvis, chairman of the Ontario employees' committee of the Victory Loan, is today a most interesting one. Twenty-seven new firms have been awarded honor flags. J. Beaumont and Company, Georgetown; Gray Dort Motors, Chatham, and International Harvesters, Chatham, have had one hundred per cent. of their employees making application.

### WINNIPEG DOING WELL.

Winnipeg, Nov. 12.—A total of \$23,000,000 has been subscribed to date by citizens of Manitoba to the Victory Loan. Winnipeg city has subscribed most of this. In the country districts subscriptions fell far short of the objective. The quota for the province is \$40,000,000, its objective is \$50,000,000.

### BOUGHT \$50,000 BONDS.

Yesterday morning Mr. Henry Moffatt, a retired gentleman living at Pendleton, Ont., walked into the headquarters of the Prescott County section of the Victory Loan at Vankleek Hill, Ont., and bought \$50,000 worth of bonds, through his bank.

### SHERBROOKE'S RETURNS.

Sherbrooke, Nov. 12.—The returns made by the captains of the various teams soliciting subscriptions for the Victory Loan were not very large today, yesterday having been spent in celebrating the signing of the armistice. The sum of \$60,000 was added, which makes a total of \$1,305,230 of the \$1,650,000 objective.

### DANVILLE PASSED OBJECTIVE.

Danville, Nov. 12.—Danville has gone past its objective, \$100,000 in the Victory Loan campaign, the village and Shipton district having subscribed \$108,000. Savage's Mills has won an honor flag and crown.

### QUEBEC GETS FLAG.

Quebec, Nov. 12.—The city of Quebec, having passed the five million dollars mark for the Victory Loan,

has been awarded the honor flag. This flag will be raised tomorrow for the welcome which will be extended to the Foreign Legion.

Local organizers are looking forward to attaining the seven million dollar mark, the ultimate objective, and thus win the crown.
