On June 22nd 5,040,516 Men and Women Signed—202,- 075 More Since Then

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Ottawa, April 10. — The final report of the Board of Registration which on June 22, 1918, took a census of all people in Canada over the age of sixteen years, in order that the full resources of the Dominion might be mobilized for the prosecution of the war, was tabled in Parliament to-day. It is an elaboration of the interim report made public last autumn, with final figures as to the registration. The report shows that on June 22 the number of people who registered was 5,040,516, of whom 2,572,962 were males and 2,467,554 females. In addition 202,075 people were registered subsequent to registration day. The total cost of the registration to the Dominion was \$361,070.

The number of people of alien birth who registered was divided amongst the Provinces as follows: Nova Scotia, 7,290; New Brunswick 3,732; Prince Edward Island, 279; Quebec, 46,379; Ontario, 109,645; Manitoba, 30,805; Alberta, 50,549 and British Columbia, 63,479.

Of people of foreign birth who registered Americans lead with a total of 109,093. Hungarians totaled 70,521, Chinese 47,102, Russians 42,104, and Italians 27,107.

PROMISES TO DISMISS

ALIENS ENEMY ORIGIN

ALSO MARRIED OR NOT NEEDED WOMEN, AND SLACKERS, FROM ALBERTA'S EM- PLOY.

Edmonton, Alta., April 10.—The Government Tuesday afternoon made a promise to the local Great War Veterans' Association to dismiss all aliens of enemy origin whether naturalized or not, now in the employ of the Government, as fast as the Great War Veterans' Association would replace them by returned men qualified to fill such positions. This reply was given to a deputation of the G. W. V. A. headed by the President, H. L. Collins, after a two hours' discussion.

The Government also announced that it was now making a survey of all women in the Government employ, to ascertain who were married or who were not in actual need of the remuneration from the position which they now hold. All such persons, the Government promised would be dismissed and replaced by soldiers, when such soldiers were brought to the Government by the G. W. V. A., provided such applicants were qualified to fill the position.

The Government is also taking a survey of all the men in the employ of the Government since August, 1914, to ascertain the physical fitness of such employees. The Government promises that all
