## WILL NEVER HAIL ENEMY AS BROTHER

Meeting of Great War Veterans of Nova Scotia.

NEW GLASGOW, N.S., July 18.—

The Great War Veterans of Nova

Scotia will never hail any alien enemy as brother, nor enter into formal relations or co-operation with any organization which includes alien en-

emies or those of alien enemy extrac-

That point was made clear here yesterday at the morning session of the provincial convention, which developed marked hostility to affiliation with the Trades and Labor Councils until the labor unions amend their constitutions so as to purge their ranks of all aliens of enemy nationality.

The discussion was precipitated by a speech of J. H. Vanduren, president of the Sydney Trades and Labor

Council, who had been requested to address the convention.

A formal pronouncement on this subject is expected to be made by

the convention today in the shape of a resolution. With this resolution is expected to go the last hopes of a soldier workman entente, which was first broached in Cape Breton some months ago, a sort of dethroned sol-

diers' and workmen's council minus the Bolshevik features.

A resolution was adopted calling for changes in the dental administration of the district.
