## 500 Prisoners Leave Amherst Internment Camp

Amherst, N.S., July 23.—Upwards of five hundred German prisoners left the internment camp here yesterday, under guard for Quebec, where they will board a trans-Atlantic liner for Germany. The Germans were brought to Amherst in 1915, and composed for the most part, of crews of the Kaiser Wilhelm der Grosse, and other German ships captured on the high seas. Between three and four hundred prisoners remain in the internment camp, including the Austrian and Bulgarian captives.
