

BOLSHEVIKI TO BE BARRED OUT

U. S. Will Likely Continue
War-time Regulations
Against **Undesirables**

RUSH OF 'REDS' IS FEARED

Real Danger to Country From
Invasion by Russian
Anarchists

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Washington, Oct. 5.—Thousands of radicals of Russia are in Japan waiting for the lifting of the war-time ban on passports to flock to the United States. Representative Albert Johnson, Chairman of the House **Immigration** Committee, declared to-day. After a study of this phase of the **immigration** question he has induced the House Foreign Relations Committee to hold hearings with the idea of continuing the war-time regulations against Bolshevists and other radicals until an effective **immigration** law can be enacted.

Extend Regulations.

As Chairman of the **Immigration** Committee, Mr. Johnston said Congress could not pass a prohibition against this class until the flood-gates had been let down. Acting upon his suggestion, the Foreign Relations Committee will begin hearings to-morrow, and, if the State Department agrees, will recommend the passage of a law to extend the war-time regulations on passports until a prohibitory **immigration** law can be enacted. Secretary of State Lansing will appear at the hearings to-morrow, and he is reported to be very insistent for some action that will keep the army of Bolshevists from this country, who are preparing to rush here when peace is formally declared.

Is a Real Danger.

Officials of the Labor and State Departments have informed members of Congress that there is a real danger to this country from the invasion of that element in Russia and other lands. Quick action is necessary by Congress, because as soon as peace is declared the regulations on passports will become less strict, and the only bar against **undesirables** will be the literacy test.
