

MANY POLES IN CANADA.

Ottawa, Aug. 6.—The latest available census figures indicate that there are within the borders of the Dominion of Canada a considerable number of Polish people. When the census of 1911 was taken it revealed a total Polish population of 33,365. For several subsequent years there was a fairly heavy movement of Poles to the Dominion, more particularly to the Western Provinces, with the result that the 1916 census for Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta showed a population of Polish people for those Provinces alone of 17,303. While Poland's war with Russia has undoubtedly influenced many Poles to go home to fight for their native country, there is no indication that the movement has been a particularly heavy one.
