

POLISH JEWS STILL SWARM TO DOMINION

All Who Fail to Meet Immi- gration Requirements Returned

LAW STRICTLY ENFORCED

Large Volume of Supervised Emigration From Europe in Spring

Ottawa, Dec. 19.—The Department of Immigration will make no exceptions in the matter of receiving immigrants into the country. Recently the department received a notification from a group of influential and wealthy Jews resident in Canada, offering to bond Polish Jewish immigrants who had already reached this side, but who were unable to comply with immigration regulations. They offered to secure the Government against the new arrivals becoming charges upon the community. The department, however, has decided that no exceptions can be made.

"In spite of the raising of the money qualification to \$250 for immigrants coming to Canada, large numbers of Polish Jews are still reported to be on the way and arriving. The Department of Immigration applies every regulation strictly to the incomers, and no one is allowed to enter unless he has \$250, friends to go to and fulfills every health test.

Every effort is said to be made, as far as the Government is concerned, to stem the tide, and the steamship companies have had to take back many who could not qualify. A surprisingly large number are fully informed as to all the regulations and can meet them. Some of the immigrants complain that the steamship companies now exact return fare from all immigrants before giving passage to them, so that they will not lose if they are rejected.

The tide is stemmed to a considerable extent by the \$250 entrance money regulation, but even this may have to be raised higher later.

Many Coming in Spring.

Calgary, Dec. 19.—(Canadian Press Despatch.) — "Wholesale emigration from Europe will take place in the spring, and Canada will receive a large share," declares Commissioner Eadie of the Salvation Army.

"The emigration under our auspices will be principally from the British Isles and the three Scandinavian countries, and will be directed, as far as possible, to countries under the British flag."

Twelve officers will leave Canada for Europe at an early date to complete arrangements. The Army will be able to provide for at least 30,000 immigrants being brought to Canada.
