ARMED IMMIGRANT. Mr. E. N. Lewis, M.P., maintains his records for bringing live questions be fore the House of Commons. He seems arer to the people in his meof thinking than most of his associates in Parliament. Now he pros an amendment to the Immigration Act which is inten ded to check the tendency among foreigners to carry deadly weapons for the settlement of eir differences of opinion. He desires to have immigrants searched on landing, and the cases of any found with weapons referred to the Minister of the Interior with a view to having the armed immigrant deported if he be not shown to be a man of good character. The trouble is, of course, that the first things which the unarmed immigrant will see, when he gets ashore in Canada, are shop windows full of weat pons for sale, From this, if he be a discerning man, with a deductive mind, he will infer that he had better buy a knife or a gun at once; for it is plain that he is in a savage country where the inhabitants go armed. Obviously, it would be no more than fair play to the immigrant to remove from his sight these sight of bur "savagery, will subsequently tell which the police him are very much exaggerated. If he comes to the country unarmed, ought not to insist in this way that he arm himself, not to punish him later for having taken our advice. Mr. Lowis has another clause in his bill which provides for the searching of any person by a peace officer who has reason to believe that he may be armed; and, if arms he found on 'a erson who has immigrated into the try within two years, the Minister for Interior may order his deporta-This is apparently to meet the caught the of the man who has carrying custom since landing in la.
