Her-bert of Ottawa, a traveiling Canadian officer, was shot and killed yesterday afternoon on board a crowded Wind-sor-Detroit ferry boat by William Fer-guson, an "undesirable" who had just been refused admittance into Canada. Ferguson is now under arrest at police headquarters. Ferguson was not in the custody of Herbert, but the latter had been present in the Windsor immigration office when Ferguson was questioned and told that he would have to return to the United States because of physical trouble. He has but one leg. Herbert happened to take the same boat back

to Detroit with Ferguson, and when

the latter recognized him he instantly drew a revolver and shot him dead. Herbert, who was travelling Super-intendent of Immigration, was well intendent of immigration, was well known in the Sault, as the business of his department often brought him to this port.
