

2461 ADMITTED TO CANADA THRU SAULT THIS YEAR

Immigration Officers at This Port Have Been Kept Pretty Busy.

Statistics from the immigration offices show that there has been considerable immigration through the Sault for this year to date. There was 2461 admits into Canada through this port during the months from January to February and 378 rejects from the same entry.

The persons admitted through this port are all citizens of the United States. They may have come from Europe years ago, but had become naturalized in the States. The only Europeans who have taken citizens' papers out in States allowed to enter through the Sault are: Germans, Frenchmen, Swedes, Danes, Dutchmen and British.

Many of them are people who migrated from Canada to the States years ago. These men made their money in that country, and seeing the far superior advantages of their home country, especially of the great Canadian West, immigrated from the States to their rightful home. Frenchmen, who at one time lived in Quebec, are quite conspicuous in this class.

The most of the people immigrating at this point are a monied class. Many are extremely comfortable and leave the States to take up large tracts of land in the fertile West.

Many are business men who have been educated in the game in the States, and at once proceed to Cana-

da to take advantage of its growth in all its different branches of business and industry. This is the minority, as most of the immigrants have the intention of farming when entering Canada. Some buy, or take free tracts of land, while others engage as laborers on the many huge farms scattered in the different Provinces of the world's agricultural centre.

The requirements for immigration into Canada are that the immigrants have at least \$25. He must also be able to undergo successfully the moral and physical tests that are necessary to be passed by all immigrants. No persons that are found to be suspected criminals are admitted, nor are ex-convicts admitted to Canada.

This extensive immigration through this port, not mentioning that through the Pacific and Atlantic coasts, shows where the eyes of the world are turned. On account of her natural wealth, which is but barely developed or unearthed, either in a farming or mining respect, she can offer inducements to the home-seeker that no other nation in the world can give.
