

DEPUTATION TOLD THAT FOREIGNERS WILL BE DEPORTED

Edict Affects the Unemployed
Who Have Been in Canada
Less Than Three Years.

CAN WORK ON FARMS
IF THEY SO DESIRE

Largest Proportion of Those
Out of Work Have Come
to Canada Recently.

Ottawa, July 3.—W. D. Scott, Super-
intendent of Immigration, told a de-
putation of Bulgarians and Russians
who waited upon him last night in re-
gard to the problem of finding employ-
ment, that the unemployed immigrants
in Canadian cities who had been in
Canada less than three years, and
have become public charges, will be
deported by the Immigration Depart-
ment after notification by the secre-
tary of the municipality concerned.

By far the largest proportion of
those out of work in Halifax, Mont-
real, Ottawa, Toronto, Winnipeg and
other centers are foreigners, and many
have come to Canada within three
years. Mr. Scott told the deputation
that all those whom they represented
could have work on farms if they were
willing to take it, and this proposal
will be considered by them.
