

EMPLOYMENT AGENT HEAVILY FINED

Fort William Man Sent an Austrian to Take a Job .. When There Was't Any

Fort William, July 31.—A. P. Rochon, proprietor of an employment office here, was fined \$50 and costs yesterday for sending an Austrian immigrant to a point 125 miles from Fort William on the false assurance that there was employment there for him. When the Austrian arrived at his destination no job awaited him, and he was forced to return to the city. Rochon was also fined \$5 for not keeping his registration book in good order as required by immigration law, and was ordered to refund the Austrian the \$24 he had spent in railway fares.

D. H. Reynolds, travelling immigration inspector, figured prominently in the prosecution.
