

SIX RESERVISTS LEAVE FOR HOME

Next Week Will See Them on Duty With British Forces

GERMAN SAILORS DESERT

Four Ran Away From SS. Tyrolia—Will Be Arrested and May Be Treated as Spies

Six more Royal Naval Reserve men from Montreal will sail for England today to report there for active service against the Germans, while two Army Reserve men will also take passage to join their corps for land defence or offence. These men have been employed in Montreal in various capacities, and reported for duty to Mr. H. S. White, collector of customs, who furnished them with the necessary papers to secure their passage here as guests of the British Admiralty.

One of the Army Reserve men was an officer named Mr. Beth Kumarlock, of Owen House, Verdun, who is a member of the Honorable Artillery Company of London. He only came to Canada two or three days ago, and had just got settled down when he received a cable from his father in England announcing that as a result of the outbreak of war he must rejoin his corps immediately. He will sail this morning, and by next week will probably be on active service with his brother officers.

Altogether there have been 78 officers and men of the Royal Naval Reserve registered from Montreal as a result of the call to the colors. All these except the few mentioned are members of the crews of vessels now in port. It has been arranged that they shall return to England on their next voyage and then report for duty there.
