lish, were arrested late this afternoon, suspected as being spies. When arrested they gave the names of William Lehmark, Oscar Haussler, Chas. Waxner and Oscar Speibel. They landed supposedly from Clayton, N.Y. just east of the town, in an old flatbottomed boat, using paddles made out of pieces of boards.

When accessed they had with them two modern fifte, two revolvers and one shot gun, besides a quantity of ammunition, and a box of antiseptic cotton.
