

GERMANS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO LEAVE

Official Proclamation rest of Officers or Attempting to Depart

The Canada Gazette, under
Aug. 2, contains the following
information regarding Germans in Canada.

"Whereas there are many immigrants
of German nationality quietly pursuing
their usual avocations in various parts
of Canada, and it is desirable that such
persons should continue in such avoca-
tions without interruption—

"Now know ye that by and with the
advice of our Privy Council for Can-
ada, we do by these presents proclaim
and direct as follows—

"1. Such persons so long as they
quietly pursue their ordinary avoca-
tions shall not be arrested, detained
or interfered with, unless there be
reasonable ground to believe that they
are engaged in espionage, or attempt-
ing to engage in acts of a hostile
nature, or to give information to an
enemy, or unless they otherwise
transgress any law, order or council
proclamation;

"2. All German officers or
servants attempting to leave Canada
at any port on the Atlantic or on the
Pacific shall be arrested and detained.

"3. Precautions shall be taken at
important points such as Halifax,
John, Quebec, Montreal, Kingston,
Toronto, Niagara, Hamilton, London,
Windsor, Sarnia, Sault Ste. Marie,
Arthur, Fort William, Winnipeg,
Regina, Moose Jaw, Calgary, Lethbridge,
Revelstoke, Sicamous Mission, Jasper,
New Westminster, Vancouver, Victoria,
and any other similar points in the
discretion of the Minister of Marine
to prevent German officers or servants
from leaving Canada for the purpose
of entering the United States or
thence proceeding to Germany, and
any such officers making any such
attempt shall be arrested and detained.
