

AUSTRIAN SUBJECT IS ARRESTED IN HAMILTON

Charged With Conspiring to Organize

PARTIES SENT THROUGH U.S.

Corps of Guides, 2nd Division, Given Enthusiastic Send-off — Civic Con- tribution Yet to be Provided For.

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Hamilton, Aug. 14.—Domestl Alik-
sulk, an Austrian subject, was to-day
arrested at the point of a revolver
by Detective Shirley of Galt. The
prisoner is charged with conspiring
to organize local Austrians and Ger-
mans, and to send them to war. It is
alleged that a number of parties of
Germans and Austrians have been
sent from Canada to the United States,
with Europe as their objective point.
Plans, and lists of names of Ger-
mans and Austrians in Canada, were
found on him, and also credentials
from the Austrian Consul at Mont-
real.

Euthusiastic Send-off.

The second division of the Corps of
Guides left this afternoon under
Lieut. Richardson for Stanley Bar-
racks, Toronto, where they will await
orders. They were given an enthus-
iastic send-off at the T. H. & B. sta-
tion. The other volunteers have been
ordered to adopt active service condi-
tions, and are busily engaged in drill.

Civic Contribution.

The Mayor was informed to-day at
noon by the City Solicitor that there
was nothing in the municipal act that
gave the Council authority to vote
money for war purposes. Some ac-
tion will be taken, but the form of
contribution has not been agreed up-
on.

Women to Canvass To-day.

Hamilton women met in Centenary
Church this afternoon and made ar-
rangements to thoroughly canvass the
city to-morrow for funds for the hos-
pital ship. Collectors will be furnish-
ed with automobiles. Lady Gibson
and Lady Taylor presided at the meet-

ing. Women from Aldershot and Dun-
das offered to make canvasses in their
districts.

Enrolling Still Continues.

The Drill Hall was again crowded
this evening when the 13th Royal
Regiment paraded, with men belong-
ing to that corps who have volunte-
ered for service in the war. The 4th
Field Battery, the 1st Field Troop of
Canadian Engineers and others who
have volunteered paraded in the
Drill Hall. Enrolling of volunteers
still continues.

Man Injured Badly by Car.
