

BAN ON GOODS

Dealers Warned Against Trading With Germany and Austria.

Ottawa, Aug. 14. — A proclamation has been made by the Dominion department of customs warning persons against receiving goods from Germany and Austria, and instructing customs officers to hold all goods that are received here from either of those two countries which left Europe before Aug. 5, the day of the declaration of war.

The proclamation warns all persons carrying on business in Canada, not to supply or obtain from Germany or Austria, any goods or merchandise, or to supply or obtain from any person resident or carrying on business in those countries any merchandise for or by way of transmission to or from the said countries, nor trade in or carry any goods or wares destined for or coming from Germany or Austria.

It is pointed out that the chances of any goods arriving or being despatched to hostile European countries are very remote in view of the announcement that all German and Austrian overseas commerce has been stopped.
