AUSTRIANS MUST NOT LEAVE GANADA

Order Forbidding Their
Departure
OTTAWA, August 16—Following
England's declaration of war upon

Austria last week, an order-in-council has been passed forbidding the de-

parture from Camada of Austrian reservists. The order-in-council states that Austro-Hungarians so long as they quietly pursue their ordinary avocations shall not be arrested, detained or interfered with, unless there is reasonable ground to believe they are engaged in espionage, or attempting to engage in acts at a houtile nature, or to give infornution to the enemy, or unless they otherwise contravene any law, order-in-council or proclamation. All Austro-Hungarian officers or reservists attempting to leave Canada or any port on the Atlantic or Pacific shall Le arrested and detained. "Precautions shall be taken at all important points such as Halifax, St. John, Quebec, Montreal, Kings-ton, Toronto, Niagara, Hamilton, London, Windsor, Sarnia, Sault Ste Marie, Port Arthur, Fort William, Winnipeg, Regina, Moose Jaw, Cal-gary, Lethbridge, Reveistoke, Sica-nous, Mission Junction, New West-minster, Vancouver, Victoria and any other similar points in the discretion of the Minister of Militia, to revent Austro-Hungarian officers and reservists from leaving Canada or the purpose of entering the Unted States and thence proceeding to Austria-Hungary, and any such officers and reservists, making any such attempts shall be arrested and

detained."
