

TWO TRESPASSERS NOT GERMAN SPIES.

Two months in jail, or a \$50 fine and deportation, was imposed upon George Schneider and Alf. Hafferr, by Judge St. Cyr this morning. The men were trespassing on the Victoria Bridge, and were arrested by special officers of the Grand Trunk Railway, as it was thought they might be German spies. Schneider refused to give any details regarding himself. He said he was from the United States. Hafferr said he was from Boston, and denied he was connected with the German spy organizations. He came to Canada, he said, to look for work.
