## OREIGNERS WITH GUNS APPREHENDED AT COBALT

AID THEY WERE GOING DUCK SHOOTING, BUT WEAPONS TAKEN.

Cobalt, Aug. 18.—While out searching for a man wanted in connection with an alleged burglary on Lang street, Constable Sharpe this morning about 6, o'clock encountered two foreigners, armed with guns, walking along the T. & N. O. tracks near the La Rose bridge. He took them to the police station, and later on they appeared before the Magistrate to account for their weanons.
